CHESS CLUB



FABULOUS LIBRARIES FROM AROUND THE WORLD: THE TIANJIN BINHAI LIBRARY, CHINA

The continuous curved seating and floor-toceiling shelves make visiting the <u>Tianjin Binhai</u> <u>Library</u> feels as though you are travelling through a sea of books. Designed by a Dutch firm, the five-level space has the capacity to fit over a million books, but only holds 200,000 volumes. In fact, the distant and unattainable shelves on the library's interior walls above remain empty with digitally printed images of books. The white spherical auditorium at the centre of the library is nicknamed The Eye of Binhai and can be seen from the park outside through an eye-shaped opening.
