A number of students have already taken up the challenge!






INFORMATION AND REMINDERS (CONTINUED)

Our Student Librarians


Thank you to all those Y7s who put their names forward for the Student Librarian role. The Librarians are carrying out one duty per week and this will continue until the end of the academic year.

FABULOUS LIBRARIES FROM AROUND THE WORLD:

The world's largest monastic library is in Admont Abbey in Styria, Austria and was built in 1776. It is known for its Baroque (see definition) architecture, art and manuscripts.

Baroque – Definition: Relating to or denoting a style of European architecture, music and art of the 17th and 18th centuries - it is characterised by ornate detail.

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THE CHELTENHAM LITERATURE FESTIVAL









JULIAN SEDGWICK ເຈົ້າກົງກົນ TSUNAMI GIRL ເຈົ້າກົງກົນ ເທຍ KUTSUWADA On Monday 10th October, Miss Williams and Mrs Scanlan took a group of thirty students from all year groups to the Cheltenham Literature Festival. The students observed the 'Battle of the Books' debate before taking part in a workshop - both events were hosted by Julian Sedgwick, author of 'Tsunami Girl'.

The 'Battle of the Books' involved students from five secondary schools in Gloucestershire who battled it out for their chosen book to be named winner. This year's theme was 'Read the World' where schools chose a book to champion which builds empathy with a culture other than their own. The audience asked the schools' representatives questions, with our own students contributing. Jorja asked where one of the books (Illegal) was set, while Hussein asked what the weapons used in 'The Explorer' were. Blue wanted to know how the good aspects of a particular book (I Am Change) showed empathy.

Our students then attended a workshop during which they were given a planning method for creating an engaging story using a four-step process. The author drew on his own experiences in Japan to explain the process.

After the event, Julian Sedgwick was kind enough to comment, **"Many thanks to you and your students for being so involved and supportive!"**.

Everybody enjoyed the trip to the full, as we also visited other areas of the festival including the bookshops, where there was an opportunity to buy signed books by the author!






