



## A message from Mr Albon, Headteacher:

Dear Parents/Carers,



As I write, we are one week away from the end of term and have just received the news of further national restrictions in order to help slow the rate of infection over the winter months and the festive season. I'm sure, like me, all the parents, carers, students and staff are looking forward to a well-earned break for the Christmas period and I would like to personally thank all those who have continued to observe the measures put in place and helped us to keep both the students and staff as safe as possible.

**Following Government guidance and to help school re-start as safely as possible, we will be asking all students to complete 2 Lateral Flow COVID tests before we return.**

As in September, we would like your child to perform the tests at home so you can supervise and support your child to complete their tests. The home test kits will be given out to students before we break up for the Christmas break or you can collect home testing kits, for free, from a local pharmacy. **We ask that students complete their 1<sup>st</sup> test on Friday 31<sup>st</sup> December and their 2<sup>nd</sup> test on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> January and log the results using the link below.**

**We begin the new term on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> January.**

Anyone who has issues testing themselves at home can attend school on Wednesday 5th January at 8.40am in the main hall for a test. You will need to email through to admin and book.

### Student Reporting Lateral Flow Self-Test Results to School

Please inform school of the test result using this link <http://bit.ly/studentcovidtestresults> You will also need to log the test results with the NHS via the gov.uk website as well <https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result>

Students who test positive in either of their lateral flow tests **should not attend school** and will need to isolate for 10 days and book a PCR test to confirm the positive result. If your child is unable to attend school, please inform school using [attendance@barnwood-park.gloucs.sch.uk](mailto:attendance@barnwood-park.gloucs.sch.uk). Schools are no longer responsible for track and trace and will not need to isolate staff or students identified as close contacts. As per the new guidance, identified close contacts will need to undertake daily LFD tests. Close contacts should only book a PCR test if they receive a positive LFD test result or if they develop COVID symptoms.

We would like to remind you of the importance of good attendance for your child to help them meet their potential and gain the best possible outcomes and future opportunities. Please work with our attendance officer, form tutors and pastoral leaders to make sure your child arrives on time and we overcome any barriers to ensure your child beats our target of 95% attendance.

We have been lucky enough to have had another busy term and there have been lots of activities happening in and out of school that the students have been involved in. You can read about these further on in the newsletter.

Last year, the students sadly did not have the delights of the staff panto to look forward to on the last day of term, so 'this year, to save us from tears, we have given them something special' ..... and filmed it.

Students will have the opportunity to watch this in their form rooms on the last day of term followed by a morning of fun, quizzes and a form party. There will be an extended break time in order to allow all students to purchase the only food that will be offered that day.



The students enjoyed an extended Christmas Lunch on Tuesday 14 December and our annual Carol Concert will be shown in form time on the last day. It will be available to watch via the link on our school website or further on in the newsletter.



As part of the National School Breakfast Club Programme we will be offering free breakfast of a bagel, cereal or porridge from the 6th January which will be available in Student Support and the Canteen. Please note that the Aspens breakfast menu will still be available as a paid offer.

### Mobile Phones

Just a reminder that mobile phones must remain away until the end of the day when students are leaving the school site. Students who are found to be using their phone during the day will be asked to hand their phone in and it will be kept in Reception until the end of the day. If this happens a second time, a parent will need to come to school to collect the phone. We would be grateful for your support with this. Please do not contact students on their phone during the day. If there is a problem, students should go to Student Reception and we will contact you. You are obviously welcome, as always, to contact school, if you have any concerns or need to get an urgent message to your child. We are confident that, by not allowing students to use their phones on school site, we will see greater communication between them, fewer conflicts related to social media and a greater focus on their learning.

### Assessment and Reporting

Year 11 have recently received their trial exam grades and updated Current and Predicted GCSE grades. There is an online Parents' Evening on Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> January, which all Year 11 parents have been sent information about and are able to book slots to see their teachers.

Year 10 will have their first Key Stage 4 Report home the week of 24<sup>th</sup> January.

Years 7, 8 and 9 will have their first report of the year just after February half term. They will also have updated reading assessments and we will communicate the outcomes of these with those reports too.

Year 9 have also had an assembly introducing Options. They have each been given their Options Booklet for 2021-22, and this is also on the school website. It gives information about the option process, which subjects can be chosen, and information about all the subjects available. Options Evening is planned to be on March 3<sup>rd</sup>, and we expect it to be online.



## Behaviour

I am delighted to report that the vast majority of our students are getting it right day in and day out, but there are a few students who choose to disrupt the learning of others and this is not acceptable. There will still be sanctions for students who arrive late to lessons, whose behaviour is not acceptable and affects the learning of others or who are rude to staff or students. I would ask you to remind your child, again, of the Golden Rule to 'Follow Instructions First Time' as well as our Three Guiding Principles:

1. Live without harming others
2. Do acts of kindness
3. Show respect for others.

These are vital and fundamental to the culture and ethos of our school. It is hugely important that parents support us so that we can work together in the best interests of your child. There will be daily checks of uniform and equipment – please remind them to have their equipment and masks and check their uniform before they set off for school.

## Remembrance Day

I felt very proud that on Thursday the 11th of November our students were impeccable in paying their respects by observing a two-minute silence at 11.00am on Remembrance Day.



## Children in Need

Children in Need was on Friday 19th November and the students raised £598.80 by donating money for a non-uniform day.



## Friday 17<sup>th</sup> December

This will be our final day of the term and there will be many different events and activities taking place. Students may wear a festive Christmas jumper instead of their blazer (all other uniform remains the same) in return for a £1 donation, which will be donated to Save the Children.

## Free School Meal Vouchers

During the December holiday period, Gloucestershire County Council is providing vouchers to parents who have signed up to their Holiday Free School Meals (FSM) scheme. These vouchers are provided by Gloucestershire County Council as part of its commitment to 'no child goes hungry'. The vouchers are funded through COVID-19 grant funding and are separate to the term time Free School Meals.

Parents who have signed up to the scheme will receive a voucher for £30 for each child who is eligible for FSM which will cover both weeks in the December holidays.

**Parents who have signed up previously do not need to re-register**, they have already been included, but, to ensure the County Council get all who are eligible, they are encouraging new parents to sign up as soon as they can.

Applications for Holiday Free School Meal Vouchers for the December holiday period is open from **Friday 26 November until midday Monday 13 December**. Voucher emails will be sent out between **13 and 15 December**. If parents apply after the deadline, there is no guarantee of delivery of the vouchers before 25 December.

## Fowey Mussels



Earlier this term Year 10 got to learn about, handle, cook and clean fresh mussels from Fowey as part of the nationwide Fish Heroes programme with the Food Teachers Centre.

They cooked Thai style mussels in small teams and learnt about the how mussels are one of the most sustainable sources of seafood available with no damage to the sea bed, relatively cheap, supporting the British fishing industry and a great source of protein and omega 3.

Later in the day Year 7, in their first ever food lesson, took on the challenge and cooked Jamie Oliver's 'Angry Mussels' in a tomato sauce and most of the class tried them for the first time.

This was a brilliant opportunity for students to handle, cook and try fresh, seasonal and Cornish mussels, that were utterly delicious (if you like them that is!).
