Dear Parents/Carers,

This year, the Year 11 students felt strongly that we should also have a whole school charity. Therefore, we will also be supporting **Winston's Wish.** 

Along with the House and whole school charities, we will also be supporting Children In Need; Save the Children – Christmas Jumper Day and Comic/Sports Relief. Across the year, if every student and member of staff brought in £1 for each non-school uniform day, we could raise over £6400! Students are asked to bring in £1 for the privilege of attending school in their own clothes, although we would ask that clothing choices are sensible and suitable for a school environment, with no fancy dress. If students have PE on Friday, they must bring in their normal school PE kit for their lesson.

#### **Homework and Detentions**

Please note that all notifications for homework and detentions are issued through Satchelone only. Please ensure that you and your child have both downloaded the Satchelone app, which is free of charge. Any problems, please contact your child's form tutor.

#### **Attendance**

Did you know that as little as 5 days off school per year can result in a student dropping one GCSE grade in each subject? Think carefully about your child's future. In this competitive world, one grade higher could make all of the difference to your child realising their ambitions.

Don't underestimate the **importance of 100% attendance**. Even one day missed can have an effect on learning and therefore future prospects:

98% attendance means 4 school days missed 95% attendance means 10 school days missed 90% attendance means 19 school days missed 80% attendance means 38 school days missed

#### How can you maximise your child's attendance?

Think of this: **Would you take a day off work if you had this condition?** If not, send your child to school. Building resilience in preparation for life after school is a process that cannot be started too soon.

Many children improve rapidly as the day progresses; **bring them in a little late and** let us know if they are feeling under the weather. We can keep an eye on them **and it's better than missing a whole day.** 

Common Conditions you should bring your child into school with:

Havfever

Colds

Headaches

Tiredness

Sore throat

Period Pains; provision can be made in school for a heat pack and frequent toilet breaks if you let your Head of Year or Attendance Officer know.

If you need to send your child in with medication, these must be stored in Student Reception with our First Aid Team.

If your child has an injury, as long as you let our Reception team or Attendance Officer know, then we can try to accommodate your child either in lessons (with a lift pass if necessary) or in Student Support.

#### You should avoid sending your child to school if they have any of the following:

**Vomiting and Diarrhoea** – you should wait for 24hrs after the last bout before sending your child into school, this could mean sending your child into school part-way through the day;

**High Temperature and or a Continuous Cough** – if your child has a high temperature or a continuous cough, they should not attend school and you should arrange a PCR test for them.

**Infectious or Contagious illnesses** (such as Chicken Pox or Measles) – please seek medical advice before sending your child into school.

#### Remember – we will always call you if your child becomes ill or their health deteriorates.

May I also take this opportunity to remind you that, where possible, you should try to make medical appointments outside of the school day.

We thank you for your continued support with this matter. It is really appreciated.

100% attendance is recognised and rewarded throughout the school year with: certificates and attendance badges; prize draws for vouchers; film Fridays; non-uniform days and pizza lunches.

## **Free School Meals**

Your child might be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit Universal Credit - your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

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For every child that is entitled to free school meals, the school receives extra funding to enhance provision and improve progress and outcomes for children. So please apply even if you do not wish to take up your free school meal.
