





June 2021 Student Contributions REVIEWS OF TWO OF THE SHORTLISTED CARNEGIE BOOKS:

Anya (Y10) has written a review based on 'Clap When You Land', which is a book by Elizabeth Acevedo and has been written in verse.



Introduction: One girl lives in New York, the other in the Dominican Republic and their father dies in a plane crash. The two sisters try to find each other after their father dies. Yahaira lives in New York and tries to protect her mother from her dead husband's past choices. Camino lives in the Dominican Republic and works with her aunt, who (apart from an uncle in New York) is now the only family she has left, or so she thought...

Favourite part: This was Yahaira and her girlfriend Dre, because this is the first book I've read with LGBTQ+ representation.

<u>Recommendation</u>: I would recommend this book to older teenagers who are people of colour or LGBTQ+ because there is representation of them, but only in a positive way (no racism or homophobia) so it will be a pleasant change from the normal.

Rating: I rate this book 8 out of 10.

FOUNTAINS SILENCE

Bethany (Y10) has written a review based on 'The Fountains of Silence', which is a historical fiction novel set in post-war Spain and written by Ruta Sepetys.

Introduction: The book is about Ana and Daniel and how they come to meet and their adventures.

Favourite part: The coming together of characters from different backgrounds and how their fates intertwine.

Recommendation: I would recommend this book to experienced readers as keeping track of the characters is tricky but it is an enjoyable read.

Rating: I rate this book 6 out of 10.
